3) Treasurer's Report (Peter)

<u>Checking</u>: \$6,086 <u>Savings</u>: \$28,297

Charge large clay target purchase to inventory. Will require quarterly physical count of clay targets. Will result in quarterly charge to COGS, rather than one large \$16K event. Jim and Tim to count on/about Oct 1

Electrical service will be routed overhead from existing pole to a new pole placed next to rifle shoot house (provides power for surveillance cameras). Holy Cross is charging CPW about \$10K for this. The current undergound line to RFVSA will be abandoned. Power for RFVSA will come from new pole. When power is provided to new pole CPW will huddle with RFVSA, Holy Cross, etc to determine best routing and costs over to RFVSA. If trenching is needed(approx. 18" deep), CPW has offered to do that work with their equipment This may not occur until early spring of 2020.
