- 1) Call meeting to order: 5:31 PM
- 2) Brief Review of Minutes from November 3, 2021 meeting: Carried as read.
- 3) Treasures's report:
  - a) Checking: \$5,287.00
  - b) Savings: \$17,805.00  
Recent expenditures: \$900.00 for propane. \$19,299.30 for clay targets. \$968.00 front loader rental.
  - c) BOM Reimbursements: 1) Jim Perry \$129.52 (\$29.52 for postage & \$100.00 for tip to driver who delivered clay target shipment). 2) Bill Bendl \$74.23 for buckets. 3) Karl Page: \$225.00 building supplies.
- 4) Committee Reports:
  - a) Safety report: Michael Baer.
    - 1) Review of Standard Operating Procedures (SOP). No report.
  - b) Maintenance Report: Peter Hoffmann.  
Five stand closed for the winter. Cory Howell did service on all the target machines. Parts have been ordered for machine #2 and Cory will come back to install those parts. Both 4300 remotes were sent back to the factory under warranty. The #5 machine will be moved next Spring to a right to left presentation (it was a left to right quartering incomer).

Page 2 maintenance (cont.)

Purchase twelve new buckets for spent cartridges and Bill placed new pipes to the exterior to secure buckets. During the winter, RSOs are asked to turn the buckets upside down at the end of the day so ice doesn't collect inside the buckets. Also, do not slam the buckets on the ground to get the ice out. This cracks the buckets.

We had eighteen people show up to unload targets during our recent delivery November 6th. Thank you for helping out.

Twelve batteries from 5-stand were put into storage for the winter.

c) Outfitters report: Jim Perry

BOM survey results on outfitter pricing. A survey was sent out to BOM members regarding outfitter pricing. There was a discussion about raising the prices for outfitters. The consensus was that the outfitter pricing needed to be increased, but two of the BOM members recused themselves due to one being outfitters and the other worked for an outfitter. It was decided to bring this up at the next meeting when there would be five voting BOM members present.

d) Aux.Target Report: Bill Bendl: Carson Albright, pledging Eagle Scout, and his team finished the shed in back of the skeet field. The shed was Carson's project he needed to complete for his Eagle Scout requirement. The doors will be placed on the shed soon. Thank you Carson.

5) Old Business:

a) Private member shoot pricing and booking. A motion was made to set the price of \$40.00 range fee, which would cover the RSO for two hours and a \$10.00 per round. Range fee covers five members (more than 5 members will incur another range fee of \$40.00). Members can book a week before the shoot date, except for prime slots during June, July and August. Those prime slots can be booked 48 hours before shoot dates. Summer prime slots are 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM & 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM on Monday and Tuesdays and Thursday and Friday. Summer time slots from 7:00 AM to 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM can be booked a week out.

Page 3 Old Business (private member shoots cont.)

All fees would be collected by the RSO at the end of the shoot. Tips would be between the member(s) and the RSO. RSOs can be booked through the schedule administrator or the RSO, who would call the administrator. RSOs must be designated to do private member shoots. RSOs will clock in as they do for public hours and will be paid as they are during public hours. No volunteer RSOs can be used for private member shoots. All Fall, Winter and Spring time slots can be booked a week out.

The motion carried.

- 6) New Business. There was talk about maintenance for the 5-stand: new plumbing wraps and new trash cans to cover target cases in the field. Bill said that he would put together a proposal for next meeting.

There was discussion about putting a new machine station out beyond the lower field where the scrub oak is located. The purpose is to house a springing teal or a high incomer for the 5-stand. Bill said that he would approach Keith at CPW to see if there is a possibility to remove some of the scrub oak and cut a path to the area.
